Spend the summer at the Newark Museum's Camp Junior Museum, an innovative six-week experience that weaves exciting connections among the arts, culture, nature and sciences. Each day's schedule includes studio art, science experiments, summer games, creative expression and visits to one or more of the Museum's 80 galleries.

Campers will have the opportunity to develop skills in our studios and labs by participating in classes from each of our four course areas: **Creative Studio Arts, Expressive Arts, Environmental Science** and **Athletics** with at least three sessions of each activity per week. Each age group participates in at least four classes per day—two before lunch and two following lunch. See our daily camp schedule on the Web site.

The 2010 theme for **Camp Junior Museum** draws inspiration from the beliefs of ancient cultures about the natural world. Philosophers in Greece identified all matter as earth, air and water. Scholars in China used these elements and added wood and metal. Combine these elements for the ultimate arts and science summer camp!

Groups are divided according to age as follows:

3 & 4 year olds, 5 & 6 year olds, 7 & 8 year olds, 9 & 10 year olds

11-13 year olds, 14 & 15 year olds, 16 & 17 year olds.

Enrollment is limited to 15 children per group to ensure campers receive lots of personal attention.

All activities are age-appropriate. Art classes take place in cozy, child-friendly art studios and spacious program halls and galleries; theater and movement classes take place in our auditorium. All campers will enjoy indoor activities including performances, concerts, films and planetarium shows as well as outdoor activities in the Museum's sculpture garden (weather permitting). Parents and guardians must provide daily lunch and healthy snacks.

Classes are taught by professional artists and educators that come from a variety of cultural and professional backgrounds. Our assistant teachers are graduate-level education students from Montclair State University.
